





The ForwardDallas Comprehensive Land Use Plan Update (Comp Plan) will shape and guide future growth and development in Dallas. It is therefore essential that the plan, led by the Department of Planning and Urban Design (P+UD), include an extensive and inclusive process for public input and engagement. This report provides an update on the public engagement process, to-date, for the ForwardDallas Comp Plan. Since the launch of the plan in April of 2021, Dallas residents and other stakeholders have been engaged in various ways, including in-person workshops, pop-up events, virtual discussions, and on-line & paper surveys. A summary of key findings from public input, reflections from lessons learned, and an identification of next steps in the ForwardDallas process will be discussed in this report.


OVERALL ENGAGEMENT MAP



THE FORWARDDALLAS **COMPREHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN UPDATE RELIES ON INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY INPUT TO DETERMINE PRIORITIES AND ACTION STEPS FOR** THE CITY OF DALLAS.

ForwardDallas project team has placed an emphasis on clear messaging and reaching residents "where they are." Until recently, the COVID-19 pandemic dictated a heavy reliance on virtual meetings and other online engagement tools, revealing pros and cons for different community groups and posing challenges to reaching traditionally under-resourced areas. With the ability once again to engage in-person, P+UD will be expanding its reach and unveiling its full schedule of engagement tools moving forward, including updating key message points, identifying target audiences, and deploying specifically designed engagement platforms and activities. This section provides and overview of P+UD's strategic approach.

The ForwardDallas engagement process started with an emphasis on consistent messaging. Relating the message to diverse audiences served as the basis for developing specific engagement tactics such as surveys, public workshops, and pop-up events.



MESSAGING

Current messaging focuses on defining four (4) major elements:

- Purpose (What needs to be accomplished by this plan?): Develop a future land use vision for the city.
- Values (What quiding principles should quide this plan?): Prioritize equity, environmental sustainability. and economic vitality.
- Approaches (How will this plan be developed and implemented?): Create an implementation program that can be monitored and updated.
- Goals (What should this plan accomplish?): Creation of citywide future land use map.










SOCIAL PINPOINT COMMENT MAPPING

Social Pinpoint is an online engagement tool that allows individuals to create maps of the issues and opportunities facing Dallas. Social Pinpoint allows points of interest to be created and mapped. allowing residents, stakeholders, and other participants to provide feedback for a point or area.

Eight (8) topic types were developed for participants to provide a range of land use and mobility comments. Over four-hundred and fifty (450) comments were received between February 2022 and April 2022. A summary of each topic is included in the following sections.




COMMUNITY ASSET / DESTINATION

Most of the discussion comments for community assets / destinations were related to the desire for spaces that provide Parks & Open Space, Trails, Recreation, or Public Resources.



DESIRED CONNECTIVITY ROUTE


While the connectivity concerns have some of the largest amount of discussion around it, the topical focus was very condensed around four points; including Trails Systems, Travel Safety, Biking & Walking access, and Multimodal Transit. Most of these comments occurred north of I-30. Only one comment appeared below I-30.



SOCIAL PINPOINT TOPIC MAPS

PUBLIC SAFETY CONCERN

Safety concerns was the highest discussed topic of the eight provided. Two-thirds (66%) of the conversation focused on either Road Safety (in relation to travel speeds, visibility issues, on complex intersections) or identifying places where better bike & pedestrian infrastructure is needed. The more urbanized sections of Dallas received most of these comments.



OTHER LAND USE IDEA / SUGGESTION


While the other general suggestions had a wide area of focus around the City, there was one (1) primary topic brought up. That was adding Tree Canopy and Landscaping. These concerns would appear to be locationally supported in the environmental research. The heat island and tree canopy maps highlight similar areas of concern.`



SOCIAL PINPOINT TOPIC MAPS


POOR APPEARANCE

The appearance comments revolved primarily around a few reoccurring issues related to parking, vacant, or underdeveloped land. Several of the community's comments provided examples of how the sites could be improved. One of the respondents noted "...area is all parking lots and few businesses. After the tornado, this area of Walnut Hill Lane should have been rezoned and considered for mixed use development due to its proximity to the DART station...."



DESIRED USE / DEVELOPMENT


The desired uses and development topic had some of the most varied discussion topics. However, Parks and Open Space were the main desired use suggested. This priority is reflected by the number of point comments near Mountain Creek Lake & Park.



SOCIAL PINPOINT TOPIC MAPS


UNDESIRABLE USE

The undesirable uses comments were predominantly located between North Dallas and the Downtown core, with a clustering of comments around the Mountain Creek area, which focused on single family housing and neighborhoods concerns. Parking was the second highest undesirable land use identified and the remaining comments covered various issues such as code compliance and flooding.



DEVELOPMENT PRIORITY SITE

Over eighty percent (80%) of both the comments and point markers discussed introducing more mixeduse development. Most of the areas identified were above I-30 with the sole location below I-30 residing in Hensley Field.









To ensure maximum participation and confidence in the planning process, the ForwardDallas project team is committed to continual feedback and improvement of engagement efforts. Below are some lessons learned over the past few months that will be incorporated into the process moving forward.

REFLECTIONS ON ENGAGENT







HARDER TO REACH POPULATIONS

Continued efforts are essential to encourage a participant pool that reflects the demographics of the city. Two of the most notable gaps so far have been the need for greater participation from the Hispanic/Latinx community; particularly those in the southern and eastern parts of the city and, in general, more engagement in Southern Dallas.

NEXT STEPS

In this next phase of engagement, P+UD will connect with Latinx, Hispanic, Black, refugee, homeless, youth, elderly, etc. populations because an equitable Comp Plan update cannot be achieved without hearing from the voices of these communities, who have been historically marginalized by planning policies and processes. To ensure that engagement findings are representative of diverse Dallasites, P+UD will continue to track demographic and geographic attributes from engagement participants. P+UD is setting up a data dashboard for qualitative and quantitative data that will provide insights on progress made toward full representation.

RELATABILITY OF MESSAGING

While land use can be technical in nature, it is important that the messaging around ForwardDallas be as clear and relatable as possible for residents and other stakeholder groups, given that land use issues affect everyone's day-to-day lives.

NEXT STEPS

With a revamped ForwardDallas narrative, P+UD aims to use consistent branding, provide historic context for systemic barriers, describe how the Comp Plan connects to other facets of city policy & process, and present land use issues in a contextual and understandable manner.

P+UD IS SETTING UP A DATA DASHBOARD FOR QUALITATIVE AND QUANTITATIVE DATA THAT WILL PROVIDE INSIGHTS ON PROGRESS MADE TOWARD FULL REPRESENTATION

GRASSROOTS AND "GRASSTOPS" ENGAGEMENT TRANSPARENCY OF ENGAGEMENT PROCESS RELATIONSHIPS

Continued relationship-building is needed to ensure organizations are informed and empowered to stay involved throughout the process. In addition to the need for further "grassroots" engagement of organizations that operate at the neighborhood level, we need to engage groups that operate in the "grassroots" organizations that provide a leadership role on a citywide scale.

NEXT STEPS

P+UD has already begun to engage neighborhood leaders through our Ambassador Program. P+UD wants to partner with these community experts to be leaders and collaborators in this Comp Plan process. Ambassadors will help spread the word about the Comp Plan by hosting events and will work alongside P+UD to translate the community engagement feedback into a vision for equitable land use outcomes. The P+UD team will also revamp our approach to targeted "Grasstops" stakeholder outreach. P+UD will connect with Dallas' political, civic, and institutional leadership, with a focus on dissolving systemic barriers and developing a shared vision for equitable land use in Dallas.


In addition to receiving input from the community, it is critical that regular summaries and updates are shared with those who have already engaged with the ForwardDallas process. Participants should be able to see their feedback presented back to them as well as understand how it will be incorporated into the final outcomes of ForwardDallas.

NEXT STEPS

P+UD will work backward from Comp Plan topics to ensure that any data collected from Comp Plan stakeholders is directly in service of the final outputs P+UD needs, including a future land use map, any neighborhood planning changes, or a zoning code overhaul. Work will also be done to provide more regular updates and summaries on input received throughout the process so participants can be confident their feedback has been heard and understand how it is being used.
