# Trinity Forest Spine Trail Master Plan

- Background:
  - Funded through a grant from the Trinity Trust and City funds
  - The Plan helps establish the future vision and identity of the Trinity Forest Spine Trail Corridor while serving to streamline implementation.
  - Goals
    - Provide recreational and mobility opportunities for a variety of users
    - Provide access to scenic areas
    - Connect historic/significant destinations
    - Link trails to transit
    - Incorporate opportunities for equestrians

# Trinity Forest Spine Trail Alignment

- Limits are from the Santa Fe Trail near White Rock Lake to the Trinity Forest Gateway Park at IH20
- Distance: 17.5 miles
- Separated into 7 sections for cost estimation and phasing

Segment 1: Tenison Trail	1.8	\$2,840,000
Segment 2: Parkdale/Lawnview Station Trail	3.0	\$4,815,000
Segment 3: Great Scyene Forest Trail	1.7	\$2,592,500
Segment 4: Forest Outfield Ponds Trail	2.3	\$3,560,000
Segment 5: AT&T Trail	4.3	(already funded)
Segment 5A: Joppa Connector Trail	2.0	\$2,520,000
Segment 6: South Forest Gateway Trail	2.4	\$3,220,000
<b>Total</b>	<b>17.5</b>	<b>\$19,547,500</b>
